

Valbúcar (Asturias) Spain, 18-VII-2015, on the thallus of the liverwort *Conocephalum conicum*, leg. Marta González, ERD-6493.

Only two small turbinate or very shortly stipitate apothecia on a very stout and indifferenciate stipe. Hymenium appanate or slightly convex, pruinose, greyish, greyish brown, 0.5 mm in diameter. Margin indifferenciate and of the same color. Excipulum minutely downy.

Asci IKI b of the *Hymenoscyphus*-type, 8-spored, arising from croziers. Excipulum composed of small, isodiametric or angular thin walled cells filled with Vbs towards the flanks. Unfortunately I couldn't study well the excipulum of the flanks and margin by the lack of material.

After reading Kirk & Spooner's paper on *Bryoscyphus* ('Fungi of Arran, Gigha...') I think the fungus could fits better with *Bryoscyphus turbinatus* (Fuckel) Spooner than *Bryoscyphus conocephali* (Boyd) Spooner. What do you think?
